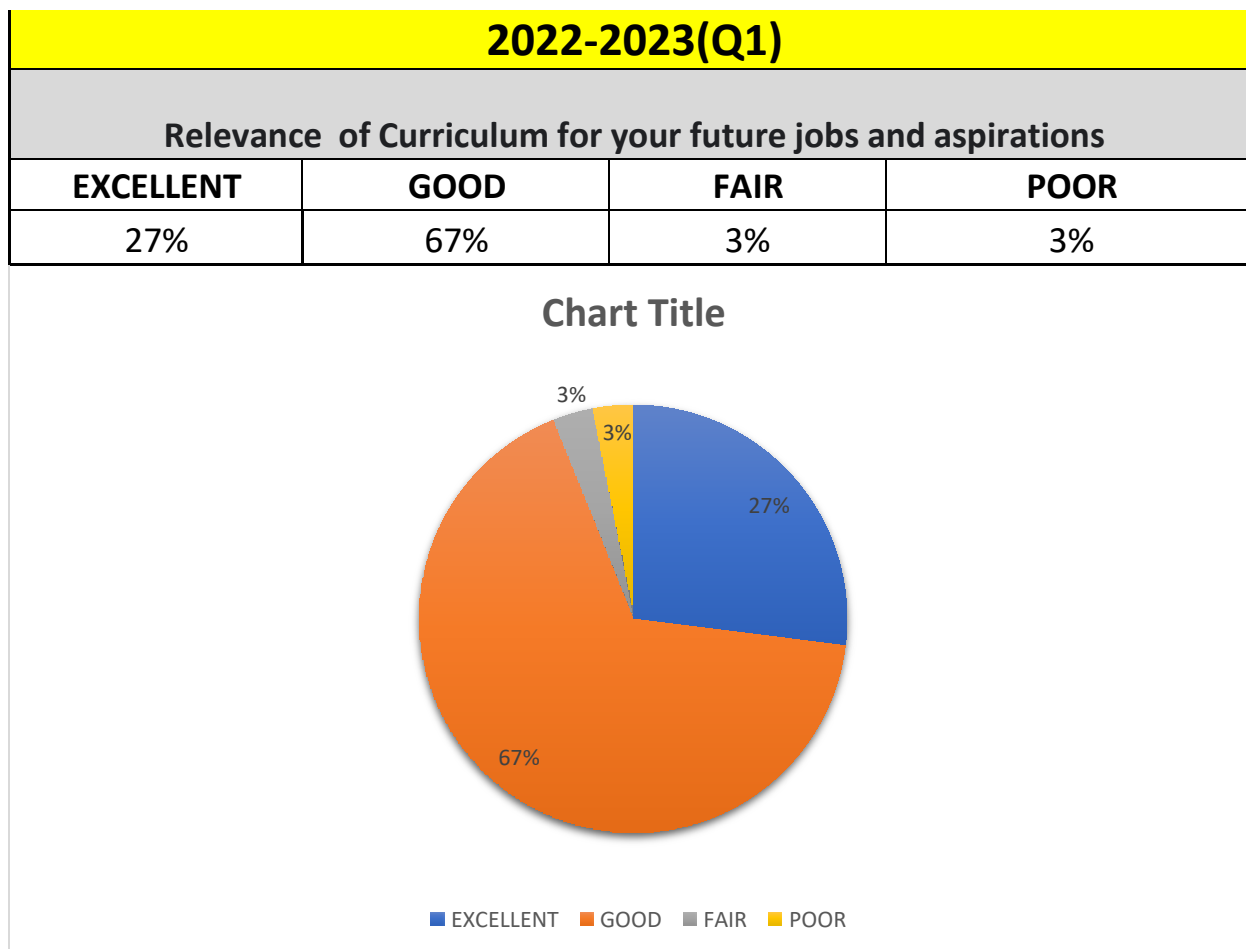


ALUMNI FEEDBACK ANALYSIS 2022-23



The survey results indicate a predominantly positive perception of the curriculum's relevance to future jobs and aspirations, with 67% rating it as "Good" and 27% as "Excellent." 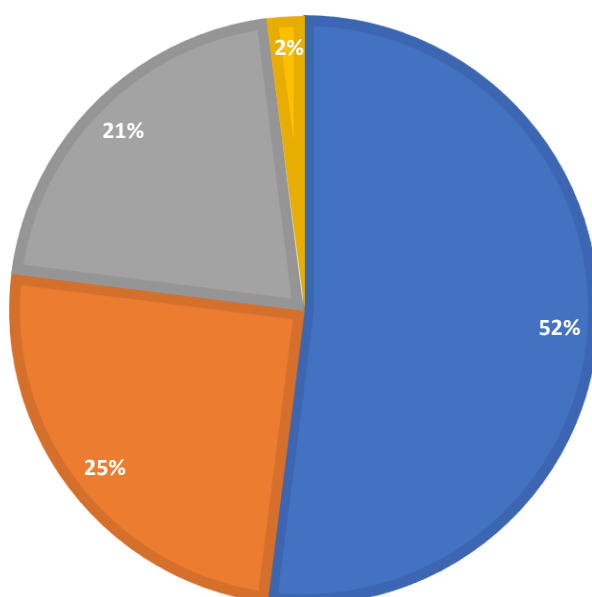


2022-2023(Q2)

Opportunity for self-learning

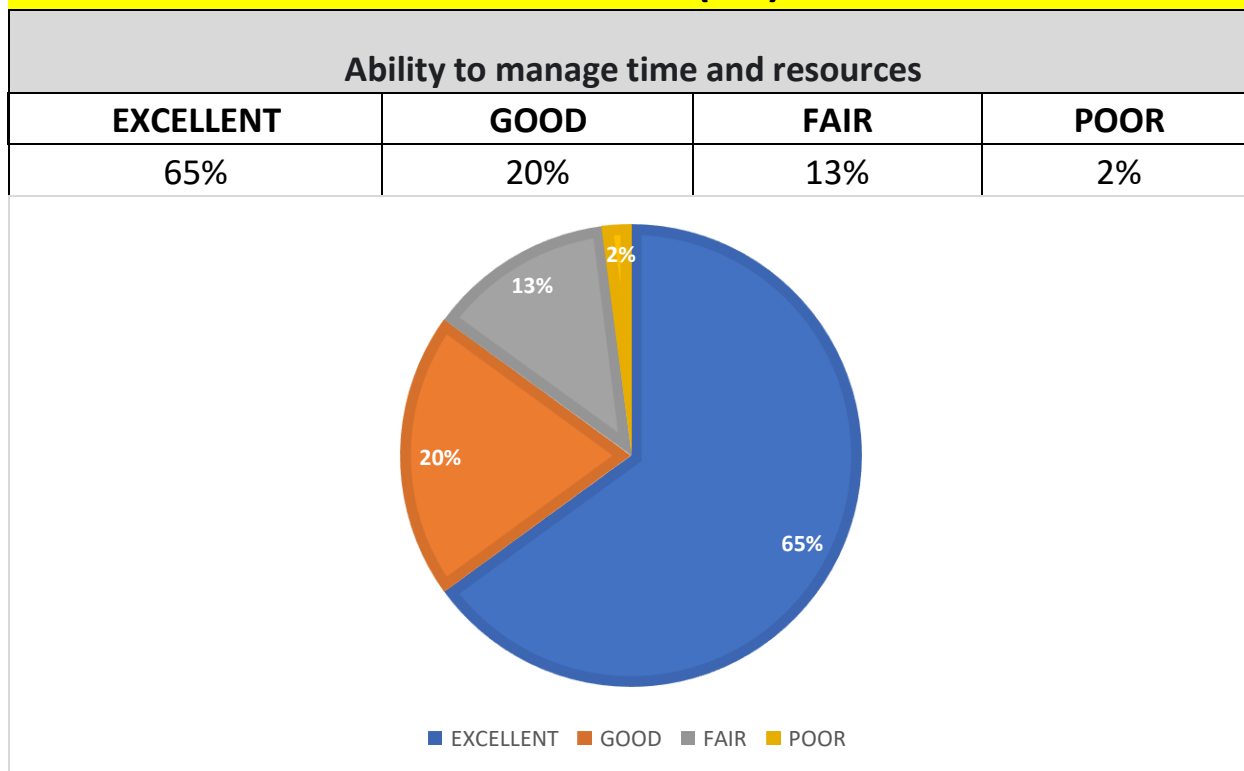
EXCELLENT	GOOD	FAIR	POOR

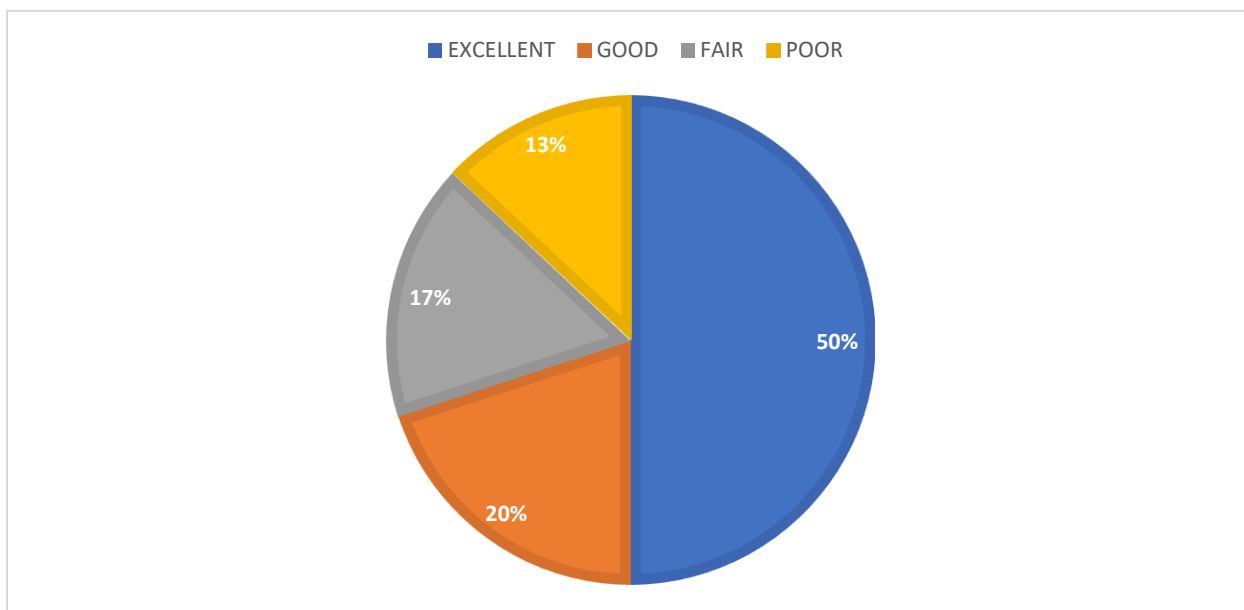
2022-2023(Q3)

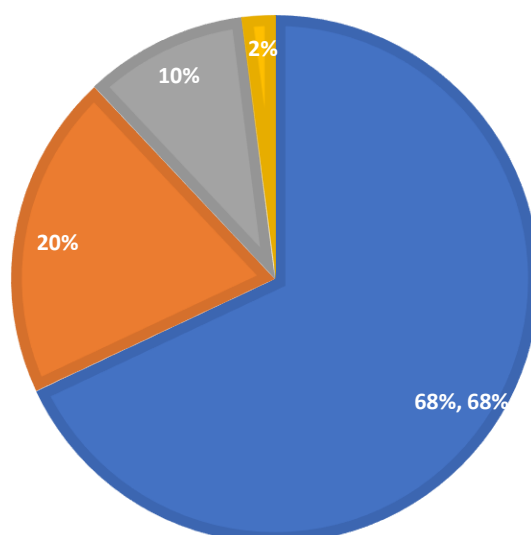


2022-2023(Q5)

■ EXCELLENT ■ GOOD ■ FAIR ■ POOR

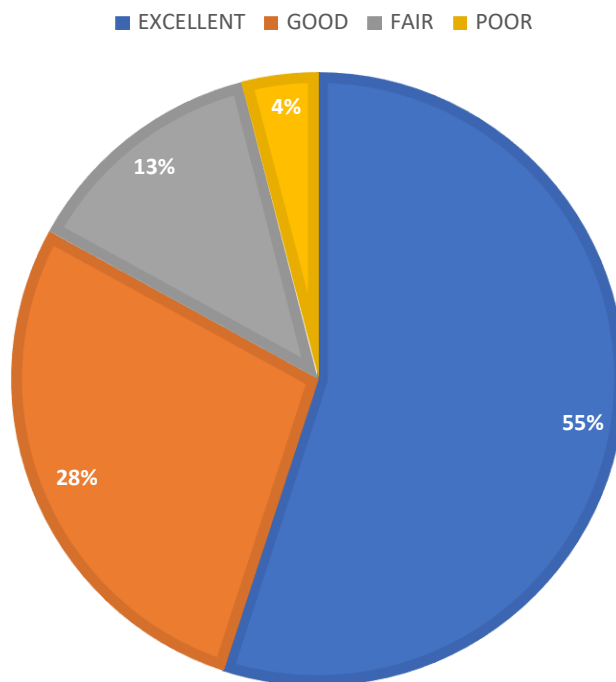

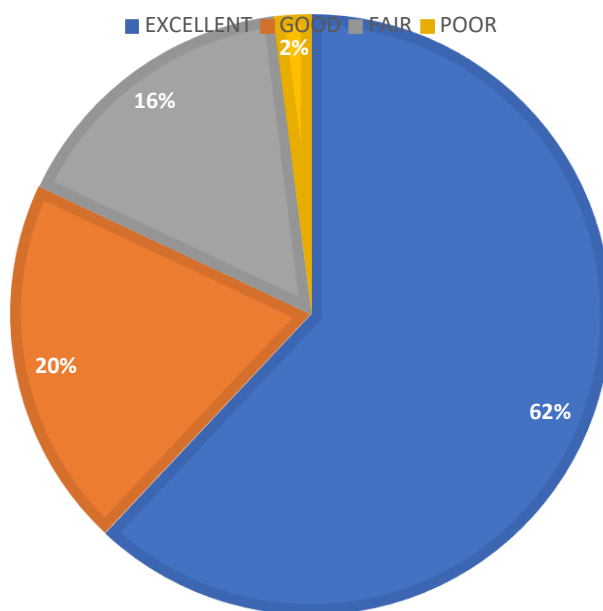

2022-2023(Q7)

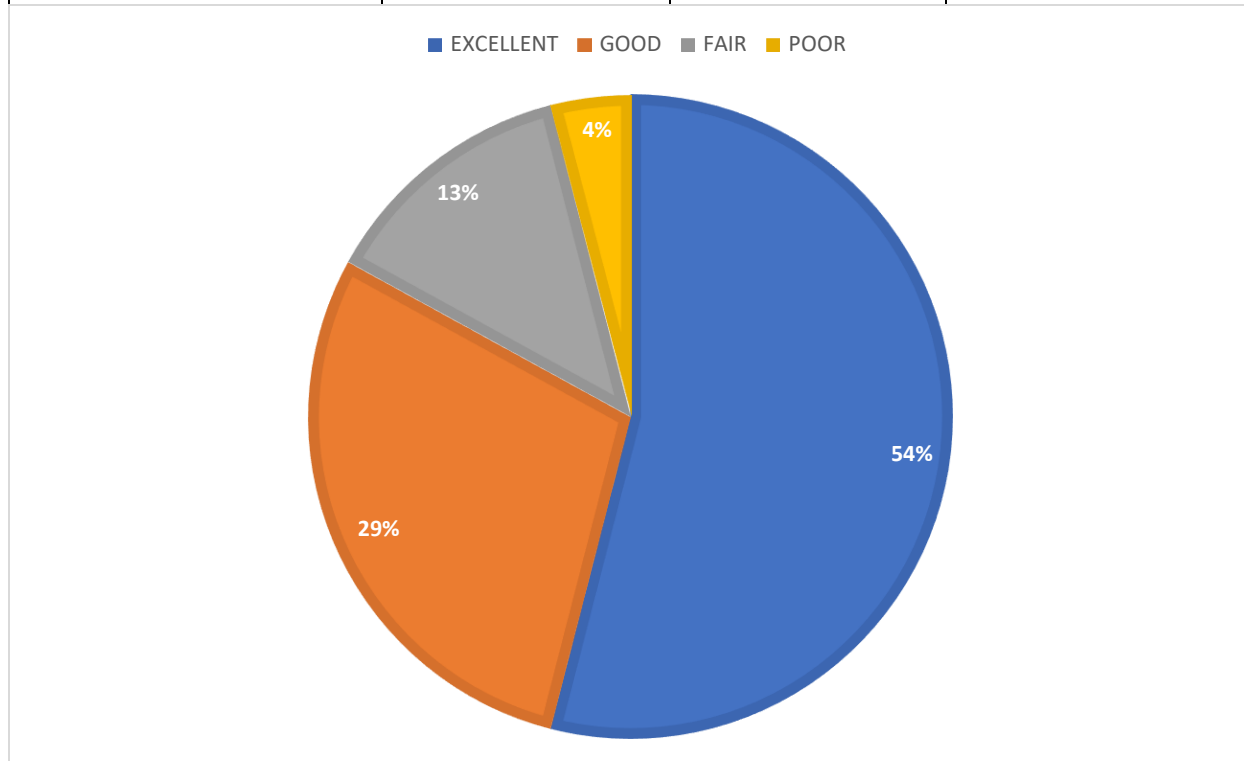
How far the academic performance in the college supported your development?

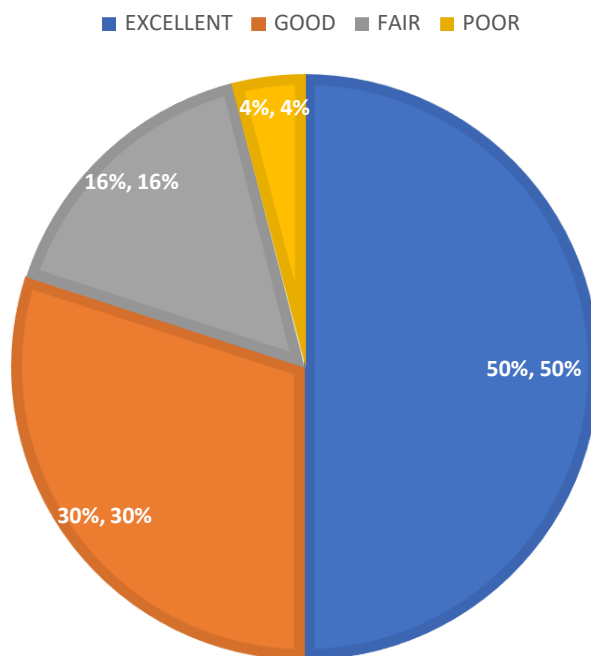
How far it helped you to develop your character and skills?

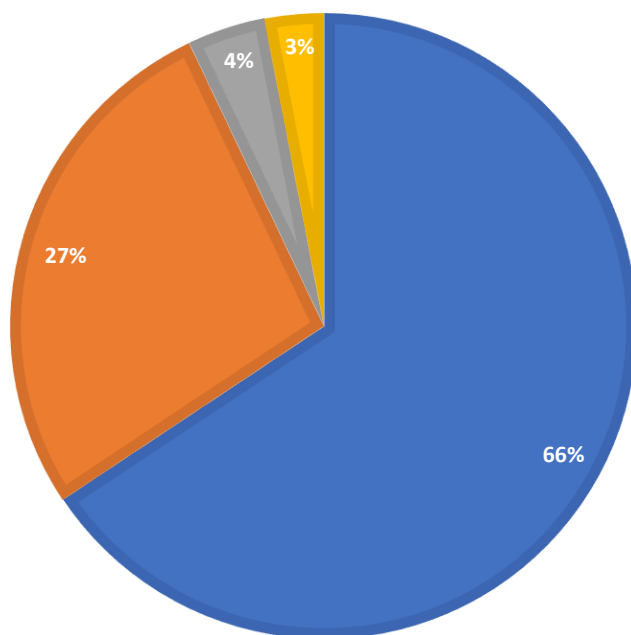
